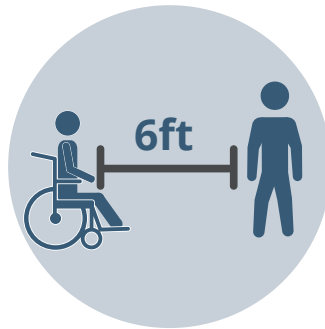
COVID-19 SPREADS THROUGH CLOSE CONTACT



Stay home as much as possible

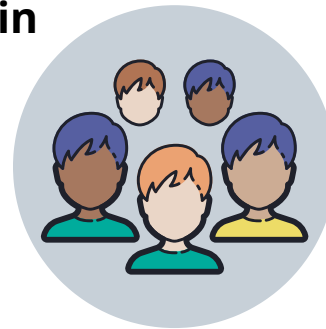


Make sure you have access to medications & supplies (like food) in case you need to stay home

- keep away from others who are sick
- limit close contact
- wash hands often



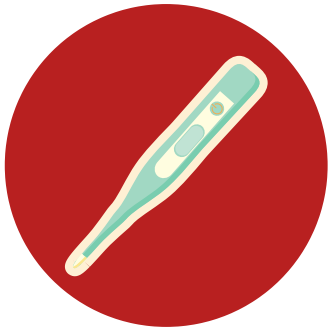
Avoid large crowds

- tele-health options

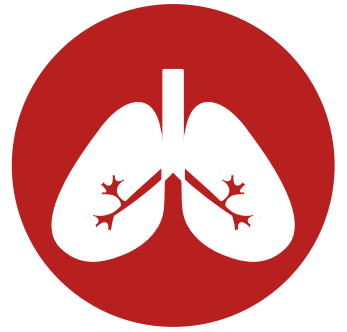
